DUBLIN-CASTLE, September 26, 1833.

HE Marquess Wellesley, who embarked at Holyhead on the morning of the 25th of September, on board the Firebrand Steamer, arrived at Kingstown-harbour at five o'clock. His Lordship, on his arrival in Dublin this day, was received by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Commons of the city of Dublin. His Lordship, attended by a squadron of dragoons, proceeded to the Castle, and the Council, having assembled at three o'clock, was introduced in form to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, who received him sitting under the canopy of state, in the Presencechamber, from whence a procession was made, in the usual state, to the Council-chamber; the Council sitting, his Lordship's commission was read, and the oaths being administered to him, his Lordship was invested with the collar of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, and received the sword of state from the Lord Lieutenant.

His Excellency afterwards repaired to the Presence-chamber, and received the compliments of the Nobility and other persons of distinction upon his safe arrival and taking upon him the Government of Ireland.
