ST. JAMES'S-PALACE, February 26, 1834.

This day had audiences of His Majesty, the Chevalier de Vial, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Queen Regent of Spain, acting in the name and on the behalf of Her Catholic Majesty the Queen Isabella II.; and Monsieur de Moraes Sarmiento, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from Her Most Faithful Majesty the Queen of Portugal and the Algarves, to deliver letters from their respective Sovereigns; also the Chevalier de Mattos, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Brazil, to deliver his letter of recall; and Monsieur d'Araujo Ribeiro, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Brazil, to deliver his credentials:

To which audiences they were severally introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

*Queen's-House, St. James's-Palace, February 26, 1834.*

This day the Chevalier de Mattos, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Brazil, had his audience of leave of Her Majesty; and Monsieur d'Araujo Ribeiro, his successor in the same character, had his first audience of Her Majesty upon delivering his credentials to the King:
