And those Ladies who are to be presented are hereby informed, that it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Lady who is to present them, should be sent in to the Office of the Lord Chamberlain to the Queen, three days before the Drawing-Room at which they are to be presented takes place, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation, it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentations at the Drawing-Room shall be made through the Lord Chamberlain, unless the name of the Lady presenting, with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered as before di-

rected, corresponding with the names sent in to the Office of the Lord Chamberlain to the Queen.

No Lady can be received by Her Majesty but in conformity with the above regulations.
