Copy of a Letter from Rear Admiral Harvey, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at the Leeward Islands, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Prince of Wales, Fort Royal Bay, Martinique, June 22, 1797.

SIR,

Be pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that Lieutenant Reynolds, commanding his Majesty's sloop Zephyr, fell in with and captured, the 18th instant, off Dominica, Le Vengeur des Francois, French privateer, belonging to Guadaloupe, of four guns and thirty-five men.

Be pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that his Majesty's ship Tamer has captured the following privateer schooners belonging to Guadaloupe.

La Jalouse, of four guns and 45 men, the 22d of May, off Antigua.

La Galatée of eight guns and 55 men, the 28th of May, off Antigua.

La Heureuse, of two guns 26 men, the 10th of June, off Martinique.

The two former Captain Martin sent to Antigua, the latter to this island.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Henry Wray, Commander of his Majesty's sloop Seagull, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated July 23, 1797, at sea.

SIR,

You will be pleased to inform their Lordships, that after a chase of three hours, Christianland bearing N. by W. ten or eleven leagues, the King George cutter in company, I captured the Captain Thurot, a small French cutter privateer, carrying two brass six pounders, four swivels, and twenty two men. She had taken on this coast the ship Tom, of Liverpool, from Riga, with timber, and the brig Bachelor, of Saltcoats in Scotland.

SIR,

Please to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that having intelligence of a small privateer being off Bally Cotton, I sent out Lieutenant Pulling, in the Mary revenue cutter, in

quest of her, and in a few hours he fell in with the Beresford revenue brig, coming from Waterford, just as she had captured the said privateer, a Chasse Marce, named L'Acheron, of 28 tons, out of Morlaix, carrying one carronade eight pounder and 6 swivels, and 40 men. She is just arrived here, and had taken three vessels, all of which I understand are recaptured.

Extract of a Letter from Vice Admiral Kingmill, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at Cork, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated L'Engageante, Cork Harbour, July 29, 1797.

Please to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that his Majesty's ship Doris arrived here yesterday with a fine ship privateer, of 22 guns, she has captured. Inclosed is Lord Ranelagh's letter to me on the subject.

SIR,

Doris, off the Old Head of Kinsale,
July 28, 1797.

Since my last informing you of the recapture of the Santa Patronia and Nostra Senora da Concuao, two valuable Portuguese Brazil ships, I beg leave to acquaint you, that in lat. 47 deg. 42 min. N. long. 9 deg. 57 min. West, I chased and captured Le Duguai Trouin, a French ship of

20 six pounders and 2 twelve pounders, manned with 127 men, out four days from Nantes, and had taken nothing; as usual, the guns were thrown overboard. Le Duguai Trouin is a remarkable fine and fast sailing vessel. On her last cruise she took the Sandwich Packet of Falmouth.
