FOREIGN-OFFICE, October 10, 1834.

It has been notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, by a communication from the Ottoman Government, dated the 9th of September 1834, that the blockade of the island of Samos has been raised.

The King has been graciously pleased to appoint Sir George Shee, Bart. to be His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the King of Prussia.

ST. JAMES'S-PALACE, October 8, 1834.

This day Namik Pacha, Minister on a special mission from the Sublime Porte, had an audience of His Majesty to deliver his credentials:

To which he was introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
