WESTMINSTER, August 10, 1838.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to authorise the using in any part of the United Kingdom stamps denoting duties payable in Great Britain and Ireland respectively.

An Act to amend so much of an Act of the twenty-fifth year of King George the Third, for the further and better regulation of buildings and party walls, and for the more effectually preventing mischiefs by fire, within the cities of London and Westminster, as relates to manufactories of pitch, tar, and turpentine.

An Act for establishing a prison for young offenders.

An Act for carrying into effect a convention of accession of the King of the Two Sicilies to two conventions with the King of the French, for suppressing the slave trade.

An Act for carrying into effect a convention of accession of the Duke of Tuscany to two conventions with the King of the French, for suppressing the slave trade.

An Act for permitting affirmation to be made instead of an oath in certain cases.

An Act for uniting the mediocities of the rectory of Liverpool, in the county palatine of Lancaster, and for the better endowment thereof, and of certain churches in the said town.

An Act for amending certain Acts relating to the Civil Court of Record of the borough of Liverpool, and improving the proceedings thereof.

An Act for improving the site of the Royal Exchange, in the city of London, and the avenues adjoining thereto. And two private Acts.
