MEMORANDUM.

Captain Edward Shewell, upon half-pay Unattached, has been allowed to retire from the army, by the sale of his commission, he being about to settle in the colonies; dated October 30, 1838.

The date of Captain Minton's commission, in the 6th Regiment of Foot, has been altered to 4th December 1834, from 22d May 1835.
