

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,

THAT it is intended in the ensuing Session of Parliament to apply for leave to bring in a Bill for erecting and maintaining a Bridge over the River Leven, at a point betwixt the Saw-mill Ford and the Chain-foot Bridge, with Roads of Communication thereto; and it is also intended by such Bill to take powers for altering, amending, widening, and keeping in repair, the Road running from Borland Loan above Dysart, by East Wemyss, Muiredge, and Saw-mill Ford, or thereby, till it joins the Turnpike Road near to Scoonie Bridge; which Bridge and Roads are intended to be situated in the Parishes of Scoonie, Markinch, Wemyss, and Dysart, and County of Fife; and that, in such Bill, it is intended to take powers to shut up all Fords and Ferries in, through, or over the said River Leven, which are or may be situated between a point on the said River Leven, two thousand yards above, and eight hundred yards below the said intended Bridge; which Fords and Ferries are situated in the Parishes of Scoonie, Markinch, and Wemyss, and County aforesaid; and to alter and amend, so far as may be necessary, the provisions of an Act passed in the 10th year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, entitled, 'An Act for Repairing and keeping in Repair the Turnpike Roads in the County of Fife, for rendering Turnpike certain Statute-Labour and Parish Roads; and for making and maintaining certain New Roads in the said County.' And notice is also given, that it is intended by the said Bill to take powers to increase, diminish, or alter the existing Tolls, Rates, and Duties leviable on the said Road; and to levy Tolls, Pontage-Tolls, Rates and Duties on Horses and other Cattle, Carriages, and Persons passing along, or using the said intended Bridge, and on Horses and other Cattle and Carriages passing along and using the said intended Roads. And notice is hereby farther given, that a Plan of the said Bridge and Roads, and a Duplicate of the said Plan on a scale of not less than four inches to a mile, exhibiting thereon the height of the several embankments, and the depth of the several cuttings respectively on a scale specified thereon, with a Section and Duplicate thereof, together with Books of Reference thereto, containing the names of the Owners, or reputed Owners, Lessees, or reputed Lessees, and occupiers of the lands and other heritages to be taken or used for the purposes of the said Bridge and Roads, will be deposited for public inspection on or before the 30th day of November 1838, in the office of the Principal Sheriff-clerk of the said County of Fife at Cupar; and that Duplicates of the said Plan, Sections, and Books of Reference, will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, and in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments, on or before the 31st day of December 1838; and that copies of so much of the said Plan and Sections as relate to each of the foresaid Parishes, into or through which the said Bridge and Roads are intended to be made, together with Books of Reference thereto, will be deposited for public inspection with the Schoolmasters of the said several Parishes of Scoonie, Markinch, Wemyss, and Dysart, respectively, on or before the 31st day of December 1838.—Dated this 20th day of October 1838.

THAT it is intended to apply to Parliament, in the ensuing Session, for leave to bring in a Bill to alter, enlarge, explain, amend, or continue, or to repeal, an Act passed in the 51st year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, entitled, 'An Act for Paving, Lighting, and Cleansing the City of Perth, and for maintaining Police and good order within the said City;' and another Act passed in the 59th year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, entitled, 'An Act for altering and amending an Act of the 51st year of his present Majesty, for Paving, Lighting, and Cleansing the City of Perth, and for maintaining Police and good order within the said City;' and to re-enact, consolidate, alter, enlarge, explain, or amend, the powers and provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, to provide for the extension of the bounds of Police, and of the powers and authorities of the Commissioners of Police, and of the jurisdiction of the Police Court, to and over the Territory lying within the boundaries of the City of Perth, as fixed by the Act of the Second and Third year of the Reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled, 'An Act to amend the Representation of the People in Scotland,' or such part or parts thereof as may be deemed expedient, and to increase, diminish, alter, abolish, or modify the Rates and Duties imposed by the said recited Acts, or either of them, and to impose new and additional Rates and Duties within the said original and extended District. All which purposes before mentioned are meant and intended to be carried into effect within the following Parishes, viz.—The East Church, Middle Church, West Church, and St. Paul's Church, Parishes of Perth, and the Parishes of Kinnoull, Scone, and Tibbermore, all in the County of Perth, or one or more of them.
