GLASGOW AND HAMILTON JUNCTION RAILWAY.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,

THAT application is intended to be made to Parliament, in next Session, for leave to bring in a Bill to make and maintain a Railway, with proper works and conveniences attached thereto, from the town of Hamilton, at or near to the Town Hall or County Buildings there, to join the Polloc and Govan Railway, at or near the lands of Horsecroft, in

the Burgh of Rutherglen, with a Branch from the Main Line of the said proposed Railway, at or near to the Lands of Horsecroft aforesaid, to the River Clyde, at or near to Rutherglen Quay; which Railway and Branch will be situated in, or will pass from, through, or into, the Burghs of Hamilton and Rutherglen, and the Parishes of Hamilton, Blantyre, Cambuslang, Rutherglen, and the West Church Parish of Rutherglen severally, all in the County of Lanark; and that Plans and Sections of the said intended Railway and Branch Railway, with Books of Reference to the said Plans, will be deposited in the office, in the City of Glasgow, of the Principal Sheriff-clerk of the said County of Lanark, on or before the first day of March next, and in the office of Parliament, and in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the first day of April next; and that copies or extracts of as much of the said Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference, as relate to the for-said Burghs and Parishes respectively, will, on or before the said first day of April next, be deposited in the hands of the Town-Clerks of the said Burghs, and of the Schoolmasters, or where there are no Schoolmasters, of the Session-Clerks (if any) of the for-said parishes respectively; and that it is intended to take power in the said Bill to levy rates, tolls, and duties on the said proposed Railway and Branch Railway, and for the use of the works connected therewith.
