At the Court at *St. James's*, the 22d day of May 1839,—

PRESENT,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Right Honourable Henry Earl of Uxbridge, Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Household, was, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

WESTMINSTER, May 14, 1839.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for raising the sum of thirteen millions by Exchequer Bills for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

An Act for repealing part of an Act of the last session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for suspending, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the appointment to certain dignities and offices in cathedral and collegiate churches, and to sinecure rectories."

An Act for extending, improving, regulating, and managing the harbour of the royal burgh of Aberbrothwick, in the county of Forfar.  
And several English and ten private Acts.

WHITEHALL, May 28, 1839.

The Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, granting the dignity of a Baron of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, unto the Right Honourable James Abercromby, and the heirs-male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron Dunfermline, of Dunfermline, in the county of Fife.
