A PROCLAMATION.

EBRINGTON.

The Lord Lieutenant feels it His duty at this Season, to warn all Persons against those illegal Party Processions, which at some former Periods have occurred on the 1st and 12th of July:—

The tranquil state of the Country, and the orderly disposition which His Excellency has generally found to prevail among all Classes and Parties since His arrival in Ireland, dispose Him to hope that He may on this occasion be safely relieved from the painful necessity of augmenting the Military and Police Force in the Province of Ulster for the Purpose of enforcing Obedience to the above Warning:—

And whilst He declares His firm determination to do His utmost to bring to Punishment any Persons who may be seen taking part in any Orange Procession, or other Illegal Display, He relies with full confidence on the exertions of the Local Magistracy, on the Influence of the Gentry and Clergy of all Denominations, in their several Districts, and on the good sense and good feeling of the People at large, for the discontinuance of Proceedings, alike forbidden by the Laws, and dangerous to the Peace and social Order of the Community.
