WESTMINSTER, July 19, 1839.

**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to remove doubts as to the charging certain of the duties of Excise on glass.

An Act to repeal the duties and drawbacks of Excise on bricks, and to grant other duties and drawbacks in lieu thereof; and to consolidate and amend the laws for collecting and paying the said duties and drawbacks.

An Act to consolidate and amend the laws for collecting and securing the duties of Excise on paper made in the United Kingdom.

An Act to provide for the enactment of certain laws in the island of Jamaica.

An Act for apportioning the spiritual services of parishes in which two or more spiritual persons have cure of souls generally throughout the parish.

An Act for the better protection of parties dealing with persons liable to the Bankrupt laws.

An Act for extending and enlarging an Act, passed in the seventh year of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, for making and maintaining a turnpike road from Anniesland Toll-bar, in the county of Lanark, and for making and maintaining another branch road, to be called St. George's road, in connection with said road.
