THE Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, constituting and appointing the Right Honourable Thomas Baron Monteagle, Comptroller-General of the Receipt and Issue of Her Majesty's Exchequer.

WHITEHALL, September 7, 1839.

The Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, declaring Sarah Otway Cave, of Stanford-hall, in the county of Leicester, widow, Baroness Braye, she being one of the co-heirs of John the last Lord Braye, and as such, one of the co-heirs of the Barony of Braye, originating by writ of summonses to Parliament, granted to Sir Edmund Braye, in the reign of King Henry the Eighth, and that she, the said Sarah Otway Cave, shall be Baroness Braye, and have, hold, and enjoy the said Barony of Braye, together with all the rights, titles, privileges, pre-eminence, immunities, and advantages, and the precedence thereunto belonging, to hold to her and the heirs of her body, in as full and ample manner as John, the last Lord Braye, held and enjoyed the same.
