THE Queen has been graciously pleased to order a writ to be issued under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for summoning Thomas Stonor, of Stonor, in the county of Oxford, Esq. to the House of Peers, by the name, stile, and title of Baron Camoys, he being one of the heirs of the body of Margaret, the eldest co-heir of Hugh last Lord Camoys, grandson of Thomas Lord Camoys, who sat in Parliament in the reign of King Richard the Second.
