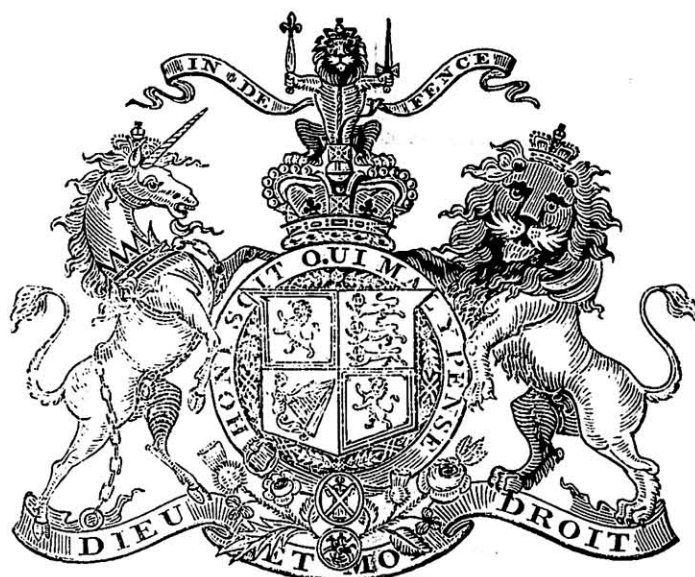

THE PROPRIETORS, SHAREHOLDERS or PARTNERS, and all others concerned in the TONTINE COMPANY or Association of Proprietors of the GLASGOW ASSEMBLY HALL and CONCERT ROOMS in the CITY of GLASGOW, are hereby required to attend within the House of the Lord Justice Clerk of Scotland, No. 28, Charlotte Square, Edinburgh, upon Tuesday the 19th day of May current, at three o'clock afternoon, where they will be heard for their interest, under a reference from the House of Lords to the Lord President of the Court of Session in Scotland, and Lord Murray in Scotland, or in their absence, or in the absence of either of them, to the Lord Justice Clerk of Scotland, and Lord Cuninghame in Scotland, upon the Petition of George Alston, William Maxwell, Archibald Smith, William Hamilton, John Lang, Thomas Dunlop Douglas, Laurence Craigie, and Walter Logan, a Majority in numbers, and a quorum of the surviving Trustees of the Tontine Company or Association of Proprietors of the Glasgow Assembly Hall and Concert Rooms above mentioned, and of the said Archibald Smith, and William Gray and Andrew Buchanan Yuille, the present Committee of Management of the said Tontine Company or Association, praying leave to bring in a Bill, whereby the remanent Partners of the said Tontine Company or Association, having right to shares therein, should be authorised and empowered by themselves or by their Trustees or their Committee of Management, to sell and dispose of the whole Heritable and other properties of the said Company or Association, and to convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, and to receive or discharge the price or prices thereof, and that the said remanent Partners of the said Company or Association should be further authorised and empowered, by themselves, or by such Trustees or Committee of Management, to dissolve the said Company, and to divide the funds belonging to them, according to their several interests therein, or otherwise to re-invest the said sums upon the same principles of Tontine, which were the basis of the said Company or Association, when the same was originally constituted, as to the remanent Partners thereof shall seem best for their interest.
