SEQUESTRATION of DONALD M'GRIGOR, Grocer in Tillicoultry.

THOMAS BRYDIE, Agent for the Glasgow Union Bank, residing in Alloa, has been elected Trustee, and John Wingate, Ironmonger in Alloa, Lauchlan M'Grigor, Sawyer there, and William Spence, Writer there, have been elected Commissioners. The examination of the Bankrupt will take place in the Sheriff Court-House at Alloa, on Wednesday the Fifteenth day of July next, at Two o'clock afternoon. The Creditors will meet in the Tontine Hotel, Alloa, on Thursday the 30th day of July next, at 12 o'clock noon.
