T the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 25th day of February 1841, PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS day the Right Honourable Sir Joseph Littledale, Knight, was, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honour able Privy Council, and took his place at the Board

Her Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Earl of Thanet to be Lord Lieutenant and Custos Rotulorum of the county of Kent, his Lordship this day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

This day had audience of Her Majesty, the Count de Pollon, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sardinia and the Duke of Lucca; and M. de Mountezuma, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Brazil; to deliver letters from their respective Sovereigns:

To which they were introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Alexander Cumine Peat, Esq. Major in the Army, Captain in the Corps of Engineers in the service of the East India Company, on the Bombay Establish-

ment, and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Her royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the insignia, of the second class, of the Order of the Dooranee empire, which his Majesty Shah Shoojaool-Moolk, King of Affghanistan, hath been pleased to confer upon him, in testimony of His Majesty's approbation of his services in Candahar, Cabool, and at the capture of the fortress of Ghuznee; and that he may enjoy all the rights and privileges thereunto annexed; provided nevertheless, that Her Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And also to command that Her Majesty's said concession and especial mark of Her royal favour be registered, together with the relative docu-ments, in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
