VALE OF LEVEN RAILWAY.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the next ensuing Session, for an Act to authorise the making and maintaining of a Railway, with all proper works and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at a point on the west side of the river or water of Leven, in the parish of Cardross and county of Dumbarion, passing thence, from, in, through, or into, the several parishes, Townships and extra parochial and other places of Cardross, Dumbarion, West Bridge end, Dumbarion, Renton, Alexandria, Bonhill, and Balloch, all in the said county of Dumbarion, and terminating at a point on the Banks of Lochlomond, adjoining to the source of the said river or water of Leven, and near to the House or Inn, commonly called or known by the name of Balloch Inn, in the parish of Bonhill, and said county of Dumbarion; also to authorise the making and maintaining of certain Branch Railways from and out of the line of the said intended Railway, one thereof commencing by a junction with the line of the said intended Railway, at or near the Farm house or houses of Pillan Flat Farm, in the parish of Cardross, and said county of Dumbarion, passing thence, from, in, through, or into, the several parishes, extra parochial and other places of Cardross, Dum-

barton, Pillan Flat, and Dalquhurn, all in the said county of Dumbarion, and terminating at or near the works known by the name of Dalquhurn Dye Works, in the parish of Dumbarion and county of Dumbarion: Another of such Branch Railways commencing by a junction with the line of the said intended Railway, at or near the village of Renton, in the parish of Cardross, and county of Dumbarion, and passing thence, from, in, through, or into, the grounds or lands of Cordale, and terminating at or near the works commonly known by the name of Cordale Printfield, in the parishes of Cardross and Dumbarion, or one or other, or both of them, and said county of Dumbarion. And another of such branch Railways, commencing by a junction with the line of the said extended Railway, at or near Millburn Chemical Works and Printfield, in the parish of Alexandria *quoad sacra*, and parish of Bonhill *quoad civilia*, and said county of Dumbarion, passing thence, from, in, through, or into, the lands or grounds or other property adjoining, or near to the said chemical and print works, and terminating at or near the works commonly known by the name of Dallichip printfield, in the said parish of Alexandria, *quoad sacra*, and parish of Bonhill, *quoad civilia*, and county of Dumbarion. And it is further intended by the said Act so to be applied for, to incorporate a Company for executing the said proposed undertaking, with powers to levy tolls, for and in respect of the said intended Railway and Branch Railways, respectively, and the works and conveniences connected therewith, and also for powers to deviate in the construction of the said Railway and branch Railways to the extent which will be defined on the Plans thereof, deposited, or to be deposited, as herein after mentioned: And also for power to alter, vary, and divert, highways, roads, tramroads, paths, passages, rivers, canals, brooks, streams, sewers, waters, and water courses, within the said several parishes, townships, extra parochial, and other places as aforesaid, or some of them. And notice is hereby also given, that Plans and Sections describing the lines and levels of the said proposed Railway and branches respectively, and the works connected therewith, and the lands and property to be taken for the purposes thereof respectively, together with Books of reference to such Plans, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees, or reputed lessees and occupiers of such lands and property, will be, or will have been deposited for public inspection, on or before the first day of March, in the present year, with the Sheriff-clerk of the county of Dumbarion, at his office in the Town of Dumbarion, and that a copy of so much of the said Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference as relates to each of the parishes through which the said Railway and branches respectively are proposed to be made, will be deposited, on or before the first day of April next, with the Schoolmasters of each of such parish, or with the Session-clerk of any such parish in which there shall be no Schoolmaster.
