IT is Declared and Intimated by the General Board of Directors of Prisons in Scotland, in exercise of the powers vested in them, by the Act of 2d and 3d Vict. cap. 42, that the Prisons of Crail, Falkland, Anstruther-Easter, Anstruther-Wester, Earlsferry, Dysart, Auchtermuchty, Newport, Ferry Port-on-Craig, St. Monance, and Kilrenny, in the County of Fife, shall, on and after the 30th day of March instant, be discontinued as Prisons; and it is therefore Ordered, that as soon as may be convenient, from and after the date hereof, and previous to the said 30th day of March instant, all Prisoners imprisoned in the said Prisons, shall be removed,—together with the warrants whereupon they are severally imprisoned,—to such of the Prisons of Cupar, Kirkcaldy, or Dunfermline, in the said County, as the Prison Board for the County of Fife may direct;—and the said General Board direct and authorise the said County Prison Board to carry these presents into effect, the same being first duly published by the General Board in the Edinburgh Gazette, and in the North British Advertiser, and by the said County Prison Board, in not less than two Newspapers in general circulation, in the said County; and after the said Prisons of Crail, Falkland, Anstruther-Easter, Anstruther-Wester, Earlsferry, Dysart, Auchtermuchty, Newport, Ferry Port-on-Craig, St. Monance, and Kilrenny, shall have been so discontinued, the said General Board authorise the said County Prison Board to sell and dispose of the same, as they may deem proper.
