LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S-OFFICE, March 18, 1842.

**O**RDERS for the Court's going into Mourning, on Sunday next the 20th instant, for His late Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Mecklenburgh-Schwerin, viz.—

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and ear-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning, on Thursday next, the 24th instant, viz.—

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Sunday the 27th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.

**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to enable His Royal Highness Albert Edward Prince of Wales to make leases and grants of land and hereditaments, parcel of His said Royal Highness's Duchy of Cornwall, or annexed to the same; and for the other purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to conform an Act, of the Legislature of Van Diemen's Land, for authorizing the levy of certain Duties of Customs and on Spirits.
