WESTMINSTER, March 23, 1842.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of eight millions, out of the Consolidated Fund, to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

An Act to provide for the increase of the number of bishoprics and archdeaconries in the West Indies, and to amend the several Acts relating thereto.

An Act to explain the Acts for the better regulation of certain apprentices.

An Act to continue, to the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, the Act to amend the laws relating to loan societies.

An Act to amend an Act, of Her present Majesty, for vacating any presentment for rebuilding the gaol of Newgate in Dublin, and any contract between the Commissioners for rebuilding the said gaol and the contractor.
