THE Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, granting to His Royal Highness the Duke of Sussex, K.G. the offices of Governor and Constable of Her Majesty's Castle at Windsor, in the room of George Earl of Munster, deceased.

April 26, 1842.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto the Most Noble Henry Charles Duke of Norfolk; Earl Marshal and Hereditary Marshal of England, Earl of Arundel and Surrey, &c. Her royal licence and authority, that his sons hereafter named, viz. Henry Granville Howard, Esq. commonly called Earl of Arundel and Surrey; Edward George Howard, Esq. commonly called Lord Edward George Howard; Bernard Thomas Howard, Esq. commonly called Lord Bernard Thomas Howard, and their issue respectively, may assume and use the surname of Fitzalan, in addition to and before that of Howard; and that his daughters, Mary Charlotte Howard, commonly called Lady Mary Charlotte Howard; and Adeliza Matilda Howard, may also assume and use the surname of Fitzalan, in addition to and before that of Howard:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
