A DISPATCH has been received from Captain Lord Adolphus FitzClarence, dated off Granton Pier, the 1st instant, reporting that Her Majesty's yacht the Royal George, under his Lordship's command, with Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness Prince Albert on board, arrived off that pier in perfect safety that day; and that Her Majesty disembarked at five minutes to nine o'clock, A.M.
