FOREIGN OFFICE, September 21, 1842.

THE Queen has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Ellis to proceed on an Extraordinary and Special Mission to the Court of His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil.

It is hereby notified, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a dispatch, dated the 21st of June last, from Her Majesty's Minister in Mexico, stating, that, according to the latest advices from Tampico and Vera Cruz, respectively, of the 10th and 16th of that month, no vessels had appeared at either of those ports to enforce the blockade proclaimed by the President of Texas on the 26th of March preceding:

And it is also hereby notified, that Her Majesty's said Principal Secretary of State has received a further dispatch, dated the 21st of July last, from Her Majesty's said Minister, stating that the latest accounts from the Mexican ports do not mention the appearance of a blockading force on any part of the coast.

Hence, it appears that down to the middle of July, no real blockade had been established by the Government of Texas, in pursuance of the declaration made by them on the 26th of March; and it is therefore hereby further notified, that the blockade so declared on the 26th of March, is held by Her Majesty's Government to be null and of no effect.
