The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This day the Right Honourable John Hope, Lord Justice Clerk of Scotland, and the Right Honourable Sir Frederick Pollock, Knt. Lord Chief Baron of Her Majesty's Court of Exchequer, were, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.
