Nigel Kennedy, Esq. and Dame Hannah-Eleanor, wife of Sir John Andrew Cathcart, of Carleton, in the shire of Ayr, Bart. the younger sons and daughter of the said Archibald Kennedy, commonly called Earl of Cassillis, and brothers and sister of the said Archibald now Marquess of Ailsa, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same

titles, place, pre-eminence, and precedence, as if their said late father had survived his father Archibald late Marquess of Ailsa, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Marquess of Ailsa:

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command, that the said royal order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
