WHITEHALL, March 29, 1847.

The Queen has been pleased to present the Reverend James Taylor to the church and parish of Monzie, in the presbytery of Auchterarder and shire of Perth, vacant by the transportation of the Reverend George Hutchison, late Minister thereof, to the church and parish of Banchory Ternan.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having certified to the Commissioners for the reduction of the National Debt, in pursuance of the Act, 10th Geo. 4th, c. 27, sec. 1, that the actual surplus revenue of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, beyond the actual expenditure thereof, for the year ended the 5th day of January

1847, amounted to the sum of two million eight hundred and forty-six thousand three hundred and seven pounds, nineteen shillings and two pence ;

The Commissioners for the reduction of the National Debt hereby give notice, that the sum of £711,576, 19s. 9d. (being one fourth part of the said surplus of £2,846,307, 19s. 2d.) will be applied, under the provisions of the said Act, between the 7th day of April 1847, and the 5th day of July 1847, to the following purposes, viz.—
