

PROPERTY AND INCOME TAX.

WE, two of the COMMISSIONERS of STAMPS and TAXES, in pursuance of the powers vested in us by an Act passed in the 5th and 6th year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, for granting to Her Majesty, Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, do hereby Convene Meetings of the Persons appointed Commissioners, for putting into Execution an Act passed in the Thirty-eighth year of the Reign of King George Third, entitled 'An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty, by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain, for the Service of the year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-eight,' being respectively qualified to act as Commissioners in the execution of the said last-mentioned Act, to be holden at the several places, and at the times hereafter-mentioned, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper Persons to act as Commissioners for the General Purposes of the said Act, 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 35, and for Supplying Vacancies in each District, viz.:—
