IT is this day ordered by their Lordships, that every Minister and Preacher, as well of the Established Church in that part of Great Britain called Scotland as those of the Episcopal Communion, protected and allowed by an Act, passed in the tenth year of Her Majesty Queen Anne, intituled "An Act to prevent the disturbing those of the Episcopal Communion in that part of Great Britain called Scotland, in the exercise of their religious worship, and in the use of the Liturgy of the Church of England; and for repealing the Act, passed in the Parliament of Scotland, intituled "An Act against irregular Baptisms and "Marriages," do, at some time during the exercise of Divine Service in their churches, congregations, or assemblies, on Sunday the 26th day of March instant, or on the Sunday after the Ministers or Preachers of such churches, congregations, or assemblies, respectively, shall be enabled so to do, put up Prayers and Thanksgivings to Almighty God for Her Majesty's safe delivery of a Princess.
