CLARENDON.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the better Prevention of Crime and Outrage in " certain Parts of Ireland, until the First Day of "December One thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then next ses-" sion of Parliament," it is amongst other things enacted, "That whenever in the judgment of the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Ireland, it shall be necessary for the prevention of crime and outrage, that the said Act should apply to any county, county of a city, or c unty of a town, or any barony or baronies, half barony or half baronies in any county at large, or any district of less extent than any barony or half barony in Ireland, it shall be lawful to and for the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Ireland, to declare by Proclamation, to be published in the Dublin Gazette, that from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation, the said Act shall apply to any county, county of a city, or county of a town, or any barony or baronies, half barony or half baronies in any county at large, or any district of less extent than any barony or half barony in Ireland:"

Now We, the Lord Lieutenant, Do, by this Our Proclamation, in pursuance and execution of the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council in Ireland, declare, that from and after Monday, the eighth day of the mouth of January instant, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, the said Act shall apply to and be in force in and for the electoral division of Tawnhawully, in the barony of Tyrhugh, in the poor law union of Donegal, and in the county of Donegal:

And of this Our Proclamation all Justices of the Peace of the said county, Constables, Peace Officers, and all others whom it may concern, are to take notice.

GOD save the QUEEN.

Whereas the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Ireland, did, on the 3d day of January instant, by a Proclamation published in the Dublin Gazette, declare, that from and after the 8th day of this present month of January, 1849, an Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the better Preven-"tion of Crime and Outrage in certain parts of "Ireland, until the First day of December, One " thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then next Session of Parliament, should apply to the electoral division of Tawnhawully, in the barony of Tyrhugh, in the poor law

union of Donegal, and in the county of Donegal.

Now, His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, does, by this Warrant, under the hand of his Chief Secretary, appoint Sir Thomas E. Blake, Bart. to grant, at his discretion, at such time and times, and place and places, to be named in such manner as in the said Act is mentioned, a licence or licences to any person or persons to have, within the district named in the said Proclamation, in his, her, or their own dwelling-house or dwellinghouses only, or to carry and have within the same district, any gun or guns, pistol or pistols, or other fire-arm or fire-arms, or part or parts of any gun, pistol, or other fire-arm, or any sword or swords, cutlass or cutlasses, pike or pikes, bayonet or bayonets, or any bullets, gunpowder, or amu-
