Captain in Her Majesty's Navy, Her Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the dominions, islands, and territories thereto belonging.

#### NOTICE.

By the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland. CLARENDON.

Whereas by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the " better Prevention of Crime and Outrage in " certain Parts of Ireland, until the First Day of " December One thousand eight hundred and "December Une thousand eight hundred and "forty-nine, and to the end of the then next "session of Parliament," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That from and after the day named in the Proclamation in said Act first mentioned, it shall be lawful to and for the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland by notice to be published in nors of Ireland, by notice to be published in the Dublin Gazette, and posted in manner in said Act mentioned, from time to time to require all persons, (not being Justices of the Peace, or persons in Her Majesty's Naval or Military Service, or in the Coast Guard Service, or in the Service of the Revenue, or in the Police or Constabulary Force, or Special Constables, or persons duly licensed to kill game, or persons to whom any license shall have been granted under said Act,) residing or being within any county, county of a city, county of a town, barony, half barony, or other district named in said Proclamation, or any part thereof respectively, on or before a day to be named in such notice, to deposit or leave at a place or places to be named in such notice, or at the nearest police station or barrack, any gun or guns, pistol or pistols, or other fire-arm or fire-arms, or any part or parts of any gun, pistol, or other firearms, or any sword or swords, cutlass or cutlasses,

pike or pikes, bayonet or bayonets, or any bullets, gunpowder, or ammunition, which he, she, or they may have in his, her, or their custody, power, or possession:"

And whereas by Our Proclamation, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council in Ireland, bearing date at the Castle of Dublin, the third day of January, One thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, We declared, that from and after the eighth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, the said Act should apply to, and be in force in and for the electoral division of Tawnhawully, in the barony of Tyrhugh, in the poor law union of Donegal, in the county of Donegal:

Now Notice is hereby given, that We require all persons (not being Justices of the Peace, or persons in Her Majesty's Naval or Military Service, or in the Coast Guard Service, or in the Service of the Revenue, or in the Police or Constabulary Force, or Special Constables, or persons duly licensed to kill game, or persons to whom any license shall have been granted under this Act,) residing or being within the district included in the said Proclamation, on or before Thursday, the eighteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, to deposit and leave at the police barrack of Tawnhawully, within the said district, or at the police stations or barracks nearest to their respective residences, all and every gun or guns, pistol or pistols, or other fire-arm or fire-arms, and any part or parts of any gun, pistol, or other fire-arms, and any sword or swords, cutlass or cutlasses, pike or pikes, bayonet or bayonets, and any bullets, gunpowder, and ammunition, which he, she, or they may have in his, her, or their custody, power, or possession:

And Notice is hereby further given, that every person who, after the said eighteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, shall knowingly have in his or her custody, power, or possession any gun, pistol, or other fire-arm, or part or parts of any gun, pistol, or fire-arm, or any sword, cutlass, pike, or bayonet, or any bullets, gunpowder, or ammunition, contrary to the provisions of said Act, will be liable, on conviction thereof, to be imprisoned, with hard labour, for a term of two years.
