Copy of a Letter from the Right Honourable Admiral Lord BRIDPORT, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated February first 1799.

SIR,

HEREWITH you will receive a copy of a letter from Captain Gore, of his Majesty's Ship Triton, which I transmit to you for their Lordships' information.

BRIDPORT.

His Majesty's Ship the Triton,
at Sea, January 29, 1799.

MY LORD,

I have the satisfaction to inform your Lordship, that after a chase of eight hours and a half his Majesty's ship Triton captured the French brig L'Amiable Victoire, mounting sixteen brass eight pounders, two iron six-pounders, and eighty-six men; sailed from Cherbourg yesterday evening, has not taken any thing.

I have reason to feel satisfied at this capture, as she sails very fast, is of large dimensions, and, being her first cruise, might have injured the trade of this country. She is quite new, and I think fit for his Majesty's service.
