Copy of a Letter from the Right Honourable Admiral Lord BRIDPORT, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated February first

EREWITH you will receive a copy of a letter from Captain Gore, of his Majesty's Ship Triton, which I transmit to you for their Lordships' informa-I have the honour to be, &c. &c.

BRIDPORT.

His Majesty's Ship the Triton, MY LORD, at Sea, January 29, 1799.

I have the fatisfaction to inform your Lordship, that after a chace of eight hours and a half his Majesty's ship Triton captured the French brig L'Amiable Victoire, mounting fixteen brafs eight pounders, two iron fixpounders, and eighty-fix men; failed from Cherbourg yesterday evenining, has not taken any thing.

I have reason to feel satisfied at this capture, as she fails very fast, is of large diminsions, and, being her first cruife, might have injured the trade of this country. She is quite new, and I think fit for his Majesty's ser-I have the honour to be, &c. &c.
