

taking, vizt. so much of the said Railway first above-mentioned, as lies between the said field, in the Parish of Dunlop, hereinbefore mentioned, and the termination of the said Railway first above mentioned, as at present authorized, in the Parish of Kilmarnock and County of Ayr; also, so much of the Branch Railway to Irvine, authorized by the said Act, as is situated between certain fields, in the Parish of Irvine, in the County of Ayr, numbered 12 and 13, or one or other of them, in the said Parish, on the Plans and Book of Reference of the said Railway, referred to in the said Act, and the termination of the said Branch, as at present authorized, at or near to the Royal Burgh of Irvine; the whole of the said Railways so to be abandoned being situated in the Parishes of Dunlop, Stewarton, Dreghorn, Kilmaurs, Kilmarnock, and Irvine, in the County of Ayr, or some of them.

And it is also intended to apply for power in the said Bill to enable the Glasgow, Barrhead, and Neilston Direct Railway Company to take on lease the Undertaking of the Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway Company, or some part or portion thereof, and to acquire all or some of the rights and powers, now or which may hereafter be vested in the Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway Company, and to empower the Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway Company to grant a Lease of their said Undertaking, or of some part or portion thereof, and a transference of the said rights and powers, or some of them, to the Glasgow, Barrhead, and Neilston Direct Railway Company, on such terms and for such rent or other consideration as may be agreed upon between the said two Companies, or as may be fixed by the said Bill so to be applied for; and to enable the said respective Companies to enter into Agreements among themselves in relation to the Lease of the said Undertaking, or some part thereof, and the transference of the said rights and powers, or some of them, and as to the transmission, management, and conduct of the Traffic on their respective Undertakings, and the division and apportionment among themselves, or among themselves and others interested therein, of the proceeds of such Traffic.

And it is also intended by the said Bill to enable the Glasgow, Barrhead, and Neilston Direct Railway Company to fix, levy, and receive the tolls, rates, and duties on and for the use of the said Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway, or of such portion of the Undertaking of the said Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway Company as may be leased by the said Glasgow, Barrhead and Neilston Direct Railway Company; and also to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of such tolls, rates, and duties, and to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which may in any manner interfere with the objects aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And it is also intended to reduce the Capital of the said Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway Company, and to make regulations as regards the division thereof into Shares, and the payment of Dividends or Interest thereon.

And it is also intended to apply for power in the said Bill to alter, amend, repeal, enlarge, and extend the powers and provisions, or some of them, of the several Acts of Parliament relating to the Glasgow, Kilmarnock, and Ardrossan Railway Company, passed respectively in the Sessions of Parliament held in the ninth and tenth, tenth and eleventh, and twelfth and thirteenth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, and of the several Acts relating to the Glasgow, Barrhead, and Neil-

ston Direct Railway Company, passed respectively in the Sessions held in the eighth and ninth, ninth and tenth, and tenth and eleventh years of the Reign of Her said Majesty, and of "The Caledonian Railway (Glasgow, Barrhead, and Neilston Direct Railway Lease) Act, 1849."

FACULTY OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS

(Alteration of Name, Extension of Powers and
Privileges, and Amendment of Acts)

BILL.

NOTICE is Hereby Given, That application is intended to be made to Parliament in next Session, for leave to bring in a Bill to effect, or to enable Her Majesty or Her Royal Successors by Charter to effect, the following objects, or some of them, that is to say, to alter the name and style of the Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow, incorporated by Royal Charter, granted by His Majesty King James the Sixth, of date the penult day of November, in the year 1599, and ratified by an Act of the Scottish Parliament, passed on the 11th day of September, in the year 1672, and to confer upon the said Faculty the name and style of "The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow," or such other name as may be fixed by such Bill or Charter, and to enable the said Faculty by such name to have perpetual succession and a common seal, to sue and be sued, to hold lands, heritages, and other property, heritable and moveable, and to exercise and enjoy all the other powers and privileges now exercised and enjoyed by the said Faculty, in virtue of their said existing Charter, or of the said Act or otherwise: As also, to alter the qualification, mode and fees of admission, name, and status, and to alter and extend the privileges, of Members, Fellows, and Licentiates of the said Faculty or College; to alter or regulate the Constitution, election of Office-Bearers, and Government of the said Faculty or College; to confer such further powers in addition to, and in aid of, those at present possessed by the said Faculty, as may be deemed expedient; and to provide that the Members, Fellows, and Licentiates of the said Faculty or College, shall enjoy the same status and privileges as now are or may hereafter be enjoyed by the Members, Fellows, or Licentiates of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, under its present or any new name.

And it is intended by the said Bill to make provision for dis severing the connection which now exists, or may be held to exist, between the said Faculty and the Incorporated Trades of Glasgow, and the Municipal Incorporation of the said City: As also, for altering and regulating the Management and Administration of, and the Admission of Members to a Scheme for Raising a Fund of Provision for the Widows and Children of the Members of the said Faculty, with a due regard to the rights of all parties having an actual or contingent interest therein.

And it is intended to vary or extinguish any rights and privileges which might interfere with the objects aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges, and also to amend the said Act of the Scottish Parliament.
