Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir CHARLES THOMPSON, Bart. to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated on board the Queen Charlotte, in Torbay, the 22d February 1799.

SIR,

INCLOSED is a letter from Captain Keates, of his Majesty's ship Boadicea.

SIR,

Boadicea, at Sea, Feb. 20, 1799.

I have the honour to inform you, that a French cutter privateer of 14 guns and 44 men, named Le Milan, was this day taken by the Boadicea and Atalante.

I have ordered Captain Griffith to see the prize into port, and having landed the prisoners, to return and rejoin me upon my station.
