## NATIONAL GALLERY, (EDINBURGH.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Bill has been brought into the House of Commons, intituled 'A Bill for the erection on the Earthen Mound, in the City of Edinburgh, of Buildings for a National Gallery, and other purposes connected therewith, and with the promotion of the Fine Arts in Scotland.' By which Bill it is intended to alter and amend, or in part repeal the following Acts of Parliament, *videlicet*—An Act passed in the fifty-sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, (cap. 41), intituled 'An Act to enable the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Edinburgh to carry into effect certain purposes in regard to the erection of a Chapel at the west end of Prince's Street, and for effecting certain improvements in the neighbourhood thereof, and in other parts of the extended Royalty of the said City;' an Act passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, (cap. 76), intituled 'An Act for carrying into effect certain improvements within the City of Edinburgh and adjacent to the same;' an Act passed in the first and second years of the reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, (cap. 45), intituled 'An Act to alter and amend an Act passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect certain improvements within the city of Edinburgh, and adjacent to the same;" and an Act passed in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, (cap. 365), intituled 'An Act for farther regulating the repair and maintenance of the Roads, Streets, and Bridges within the Middle District of the County of Edinburgh, and the assessments payable in respect thereof, and for other purposes relating thereto.' And it is also intended by the said Bill, to take power to the Commissioners and Trustees for Manufactures and Improvements in Scotland, to erect upon the ground acquired from the Magistrates and Town Council of Edinburgh and others, such Buildings and appurtenances as shall be necessary for a National Gallery of Art and other purposes, according to a Plan to be approved of by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and to ratify and confirm the conveyances of such ground to the said Trustees and Commissioners; and also to divert the present Road or Roads on the Mound, or such part thereof as may be necessary, and to substitute in place thereof another Road or Roads, which may, in the opinion of the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, be equally convenient for the public, and to vest the said Ground and Buildings and appurtenances in the said Trustees and Commissioners.

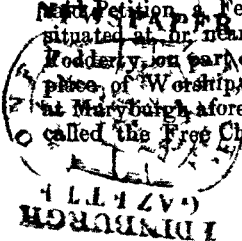
