A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the seventeenth day of this instant December, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said seventeenth day of December instant, to Tuesday the fourth day of February next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday the fourth day of February next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday the fourth day of February next.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of Our reign.

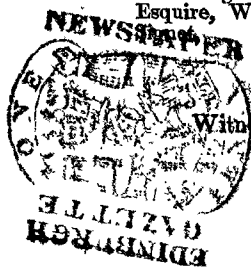
