His Majesty's sloop Spitfire, Plymouth Sound, April 7. 1799.

SIR,

I have the honour to acquaint you that the Spitfire captured, in the violent gale of the 31st ultimo, Scilly bearing N.N.W. fourteen leagues, the French brig privateer Refolu, of 14 six and eight-pounder guns, and 65 men, perfectly new, being her first cruize, out two days from St Maloes, had not made any capture. Copy of a letter from Captain D'AUVERGNE, Prince of Bouillon, Commander of his Majesty's ship Bravo, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated at Jersey the 6th inst.

SIR,

Inclosed I have the honour to transmit you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners, Captain Lord Proby's report to me of his capture, in his Majesty's ship Danae, commanded by him, of a French national armed vessel that had only left St Maloes a few hours before he fell in with her yesterday.

St Helier, Danae, April 4. 1799.

I have the honour to acquaint you, that his Majesty's ship under my command captured the French national lugger Le Sans Quartier this morning, off Les Isles de Chofey.

The prize is pierced for 14 guns, but all she had on board were thrown overboard in the chase; she has 56 men.
