CLARENDON.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 12th and 13th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make provision during the present year, and to the end of the year 1851,

"relating to the Collection of County Cess in Ireland, and to the remuneration of the Collectors thereof," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, by an Order to be published in the Dublin Gazette, from time to time, to order and declare that in and for any county or barony in such Order specified, the provisions thereafter contained, relating to the security to be given by any High Constable or Collector of Grand Jury Cess, for the due collection of the same, shall be in force during the then current year.

Now We, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, do hereby, in pursuance of the power given to Us by the said recited Act, order and declare, that in and for the county of Wexford, the provisions in the said Act contained, relating to the security to be given by any High Constable or Collector of Grand Jury Cess, for the due collection of the same, shall be in force during the now current year.
