Edmonton Union.—Cheshunt Parish.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Cheshunt, in the county of Hertford.

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas the population of the parish of Cheshunt, in the county of Hertford, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons: And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, it was unanimously Resolved,—

That it is desirable to apply within this parish so much of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, cap. 57, as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk; and that the Churchwardens be authorized to write to the Poor Law Commissioners requesting them forthwith to make an order under their seal of office that such portion of the said Act be applied to and put in force within this parish.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above Resolution.

Now therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct that so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of vestry or other meetings in churches, and for regulating the appointment of vestry clerks," as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Cheshunt.

And we do hereby order and direct, that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
