REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING-ROOMS.

The Ladies who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing-Rooms are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names legibly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence Chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

And those Ladies who are to be presented are hereby informed it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office on the second day previous to the Drawing-Rooms (for that announced for the 15th of May on Truesday the 13th of May), before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which names shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that in every case written cards only be delivered.

A PROCLAMATION.

For apprehending George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore. *VICTORIA* R.

Whereas George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore have severally been guilty of a breach of the privileges of the House of Commons; and whereas the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore have been severally ordered, for their said offences, to be taken into the custody of the Serjeant-at-Arms attending the House of Commons; and whereas the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore have evaded all attempts to discover or take them into custody; and whereas an humble Address bath been presented to Her Majesty, that she will be graciously pleased immediately to issue Her Royal Procla-mation, with such reward as Her Majesty shall think proper, for discovering, apprehending, and detaining George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore: We therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, have thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation hereby commanding all Our loving subjects, who may know or discover where the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore, or any of them, may be found, forthwith to give information thereof to Our Privy Council, or to one of our Principal Secretaries of State, or to the Serjeant-at-Arms attending our said House of Commons, and We do hereby promise and declare that whosoever shall give such information as aforesaid, whereby the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore, or any or either of them, shall be apprehended and taken into the custody of the said Serjeant, shall be entitled as a reward to the sum of fifty Pounds for each and every of the said persons who shall be so apprehended, which said sums the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby directed to pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court, at Buckingham-Palace, this fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Our reign.
