INTIMATION is Hereby Given, that SIR WILLIAM DRUMMOND STEWART of GRANDTULLY, Baronet, Heir of Entail infest and in possession of the Entailed Lands and Estates of Grandtully, Murthly, Strathbraan, and others, situated in the County of Perth, has presented a Petition to the Court of Session, (First Division, Mr Lindsay, Clerk,) in terms of the Act 11 and 12 Victoria, cap. 36, entituled 'An Act for the Amendment of the Law of Entail in Scotland,' praying their Lordships to grant warrant to and authorise the Petitioner to execute, in favour of any party he may think fit, a Bond or Bonds of Annualrent in ordinary form over the said Entailed Estates, or any portion thereof, binding himself and his heirs of tailzie to make payment of an Annualrent during the period of his own life and twenty-five years thereafter, such Annualrent during his own life not exceeding the legal interest of the sum of L.9,217, 15s. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ d., being three-fourth parts of the sum of L.12,290 : 11 : 3 $\frac{1}{2}$, found and declared by an interim decree, dated 8th February 1851, pronounced by Lord Ivory, to have been expended by the Petitioner (being a part of the sum of L.29,719 : 14 : 4 6-12ths expended on Improvements, as libelled in an Action of Declarator of Improvements raised at the Petitioner's instance, under the 10th Geo. III, cap. 51, against the Heirs of Entail succeeding to him in the foresaid Estates), and during the twenty-five years after his decease, not exceeding the sum of L.7, 2s. for every L.100 of such three-fourth parts as aforesaid, and so in proportion for any greater or less sum, and such Annualrent being payable by equal moieties half-yearly, at the terms of Whitsunday and Martinmas, beginning the first term's payment at the first term of Whitsunday or Martinmas after the date of the Bond, for the proportion of Annualrent then due, with legal interest and penalties in case of failure, in terms of the 16th Section of the Act 11th and 12th Victoria, cap. 36, above recited : Or otherwise, in the option of the Petitioner, to grant warrant to, and authorise him to execute in favour of any party or parties who may advance to the Petitioner the amount of two-third parts of the sum on which the amount of the said Bond of Annualrent, if granted, would be calculated, in terms of said Act, a Bond and Disposition in Security, or Bonds and Dispositions in Security, in ordinary form over the said Entailed Estate, or any portion thereof, other than the mansion-house, offices, and policies, for the amount so advanced, with the due and legal interest thereof from the date of such advance until repaid, and with corresponding penalties, such Bonds and Dispositions in Security containing all clauses usual in Bonds and Dispositions in Security granted over Estates in Scotland held in fee-simple, in terms of the 18th Section of the said Act 11th and 12th Victoria, cap. 36, above recited : On which Petition the Lords of the First Division have pronounced the following Interlocutor:—'Edinburgh, 28th May 1851.—The Lords appoint this Petition to be intimated on the Walls and in the Minute-Book for fourteen days, and advertised in the Edinburgh Gazette and Newspapers mentioned in the Petition, in terms of the Statute; and further, grant warrant for serving the same on the persons mentioned in the prayer thereof, in terms of the Acts of Sederunt; and ordain them to lodge Answers thereto, if so advised, within fourteen days from the date of service if within Scotland, and sixty days if furth thereof.
