In obedience to your orders of the 23d instant, I proceeded with his Majesty's hired armed cutter Ann under my command for the protection of the fishery off Folkestone; I last night weighed with five boats; at eight P. M. saw a lugger and gave chase; after a running fight of two hours I came up with and captured her; she proves to be L'Aimable Therese, of four carriage guns and twenty-seven men.

Herewith I transmit you a letter from Lieutenant George Miller, late Acting Commander of his Majesty's sloop Transfer, giving an account of the capture of a small French privateer.

I have the satisfaction to inform your Lordship, that on the 11th inst. I captured off Ayamonte the French privateer L'Escamoteur, carrying three six-pounders and 34 men.
