T is bereby notified that the Right Honourable Lord John Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has re-ceived from Colonel Hugh Rose, Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Constantinople, a Despatch, bearing date the 17th of December last, inclosing an Official Note dated the 15th of December last, addressed to him by Fuad Effendi the Ottoman Minister for Foreign Affairs, announcing the establishment of the blockade of the coasts which extend from Dulcigno to the extreme Turkish frontier, by the naval forces of His Imperial Majesty, the Sultan, for the purpose of preventing munitions of war or provisions from being landed upon the said coasts.
