

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held at the house known as the School House, in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday the fourth day of March instant, it was resolved—

“That the Churchwardens be requested to make application to the Poor Law Commissioners for an Order under their seal of office, that such part of the Act of Parliament of the 13 & 14 Victoria, cap. 57, as regulates the appointment and duties of Vestry Clerks may be applied to and put in force in the parish of Wanstead,”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above Resolution :

Now therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct :—

ART. 1. That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Wanstead.

ART. 2. That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
