DUBLIN CASTLE, July 25, 1853.

This day the Privy Council assembled, when the Right Honourable Maziere Brady, Lord High Chancellor of Ireland, His Grace Richard, Archbishop of Dublin, and the Right Honourable Sir Edward Blakeney, G.C.B., Lieutenant - General Commanding the Forces in Ireland, were sworn Lords Justices of Ireland.
