THE Queen has been pleased to approve of Don Francesco Stella as Vice-Consul at Malta for His Majesty the King of the Two Sicilies.

WHITEHALL, July 19, 1853.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto William Corbould, of Tacolneston, in the county of Norfolk, Clerk, son of John Corbould, late of Bracon Ash, in the said county, Clerk, by Elizabeth his wife, sister of John Warren, late of Tacolneston aforesaid, Clerk, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in a codicil to the last will and testament of Elizabeth Catherine Warren, late of Tacolneston aforesaid, deceased, the widow and relict of the said Reverend John Warren, take and henceforth use the surname of Warren, in addition to and im-mediately after that of Corbould, and that he and they may bear the arms of Warren quarterly with his and their own family arms; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
