NOTICE TO MARINERS.

ALL the floating-lights are now laid out and lighted.

not then be laid out again before the 1st of March. That the Light-vessels in "Drogden" and the Lœssö-Strait, are ordered to keep their stations as long as the ice permits them to do so. If the floating-ice should force them to leave their stations, they will not be laid out again before the 1st of March.

When the Light-vessel in the "Lœssö-Strait" is not on her station, on account of ice in the Cattegat, a white flag with a blue perpendicular stripe will still, according to the notification of the 9th November, be hoisted on the light-houses of Hanstholm and Skagen; if, from other reasons, it shall be obliged to leave the station, a red ball will appear on the light-houses of Skagen and Hirtsholm.
