**L**ORD PANMURE has this day received two Despatches and their Enclosures, of which the following are Copies, addressed to his Lordship by General Simpson :—

My LORD,  
*Before Sevastopol,  
September 11, 1855.*

I HAVE but little to add to the Despatch I had the honour to send you yesterday by Major Curzon.

Every effort is being made to take possession of the vast quantity of warlike stores left by the enemy in the town. I am unable at present to give your Lordship any details.

I transmit the Medical Report of Dr Hall.

I rejoice to see by it that many of the wounds are not of so serious a nature as those received on the 18th June.

I enclose the List of Casualties, which, I regret to say, are not complete.

*Camp before Sevastopol,  
September 9, 1855.*

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to enclose a Return of Casualties in the attack on the Redan yesterday ; and I have much satisfaction in being able to state that nearly the whole of the wounded were brought in, in the course of the afternoon and early part of the night, accommodated in either their own regimental hospitals, or in the general hospital in camp, and their injuries promptly and properly attended to by the medical officers. Those men who fell wounded too near to the enemy's works to admit of their removal were brought in early this morning,

as well as such wounded Russians as had been left in the Redan by their countrymen.

The List of Casualties, though numerous, is not of so serious a character as that of the 18th June, and I hope many of the wounded will soon be restored to the ranks.

The ambulance conveyance, under Captain Pigott's orders, was efficiently conducted, and I have much pleasure in bearing testimony to the care and steady conduct of the drivers in the execution of their duty.

Of the skill and attention of the medical officers, both staff and regimental, as well as of those gentlemen who had volunteered their services from the Civil Hospitals at Smyrna and Renkeoi, and from the General Hospital at Scutari, I cannot speak too highly ; and I beg to bring under your notice Dr Alexander, Deputy Inspector-General of Hospitals ; Dr A. Gordon, Staff-Surgeon, First Class ; and Dr Mouat, Staff-Surgeon, First Class ; for their able professional aid and zealous exertions in providing for the wants of the wounded, the two former in the Light and 2d Divisions, and the latter in the General Hospital in camp.

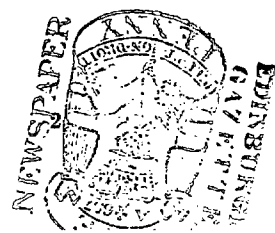

ADMIRALTY, September 26, 1855.

A DESPATCH, of which the following is a Copy, has been received from Rear-Admiral Sir Edmund Lyons, Bart., G.C.B., Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean and Black Sea :—

No. 771. *Royal Albert, off Sevastopol, September 15, 1855.*

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty will have been already informed by my letters from Kertch of last June, and by my recent telegraphic messages from hence, that the Russians had annihilated their fleet in this part of the world, leaving the Allies undisputed masters of the Sea of Azoff, as well as of the Black Sea ; that they had blown up and abandoned their last holds on the coast of Circassia, and that, after a gallant defence against an unparalleled siege, they had been defeated and obliged to evacuate the south side of the Harbour of Sevastopol, on which are situated the naval and military arsenals, the public buildings, and the town.

2. I have now to request you to acquaint their Lordships that the enemy has not succeeded in his endeavours to destroy all the forts on the south side. Fort Paul, it is true, is literally blown to atoms, and Fort Alexander is very much damaged, but the Quarantine Fort has not suffered considerably by the explosion of the magazine, the sea face remaining perfect, and most of the guns being fit for use, few of these being even spiked. At Fort Nicholas the preparations for blowing it up had not been completed, and though the flames have made some havoc in the interior, the stone work appears to be uninjured, and the earthworks on the sea-defences remain in a perfect state.

3. The five docks and the adjoining basins are magnificent, and, together with the steam machinery for filling them from the Tchernaya and for pumping them out, are in excellent order ; and the resources of all kinds still remaining after the enormous expenditure during the siege, showed very plainly the importance the enemy attached to having a large dépôt at the threshold of the Bosphorus.

4. The bottom of the splendid harbour is now encumbered with more than 50 sunken vessels, including 18 sail of the line and several frigates and steamers, whose menacing attitude but a short time ago materially contributed to bring on the war in which we are now engaged.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the stamp duties on newspapers, and to provide for the transmission by Post of printed periodical publications," it was enacted, amongst other things, that it should be lawful for the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by Warrant under their hands, to allow any printed newspaper (British, Colonial, or Foreign), to be transmitted by the Post between places in the United Kingdom and Her Majesty's Colonies or Foreign Countries, either free of postage, or subject to such rates of postage, (not



exceeding two pence for each newspaper, as the Commissioners of the Treasury, or the Postmaster-General, with their consent, should from time to time think fit.

And whereas by a certain Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 30th day of June 1855, it was ordered and directed that the several printed newspapers and publications therein mentioned might be transmitted by the Post between any part of the several places mentioned in the Schedule thereto annexed, either free or at the rates of postage in the now reciting Warrant expressed and contained.

And whereas it is expedient that the newspapers hereinafter mentioned should be transmitted by the Post free of postage.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power reserved to us in and by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the Statute in that case made and provided, order, direct, and consent, that British newspapers shall and may be transmitted by the Post from any place in the United Kingdom to Prussia, Hamburgh, Bremen, Lubeck, or Oldenburgh (the sea conveyance between the United Kingdom and such countries being direct by private ship), free of postage, any thing in the said recited Warrant of the 30th day of June 1855 contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

And we do further order and direct that the British newspapers hereinbefore mentioned shall be transmitted by the Post under this Warrant in conformity with, and under and subject to, the several orders, regulations, conditions, and restrictions under which British newspapers, posted in the United Kingdom, are now or may hereafter be transmitted by the Post to places beyond the seas.

And we further order and direct that the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, may, by Warrant under their hands duly made, at any time hereafter alter or revoke any of the orders, regulations, conditions, and restrictions hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other regulations, conditions, and restrictions in lieu thereof.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, and at any time after the passing of that Act, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage or inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the Post of Foreign or Colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in us in and by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the Statute in

that case made and provided), order and direct that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight transmitted by the Post direct by British packet-boat between any ports in the British Colonies, or between any ports in the British Colonies and any Foreign port (not in any such cases passing through the United Kingdom), there shall be charged and taken (in lieu of the rates heretofore chargeable for the sea conveyance of such letters) a packet postage of fourpence.

And we direct that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, progressive and additional rates of postage as follows (that is to say) :—

On every such letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight rates of postage.

And for every ounce in weight, above the weight of four ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage, and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces shall be charged as one additional ounce, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we further direct that the rates of postage chargeable on such letters as aforesaid, for the sea conveyance thereof, shall be charged in addition to any inland colonial rates that may be payable thereon.

And we further direct that nothing in this Warrant contained shall in anywise alter, prejudice, or affect the exemptions and privileges granted by the said recited Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, nor in anywise prejudice or affect the privilege which officers, seamen, and soldiers employed in Her Majesty's service, and seamen and soldiers employed in the service of the East India Company, now by law enjoy of sending and receiving letters by the Post, subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same.

And we further direct that the term "by the Post," used in this Warrant, shall include the conveyance through Egypt.

And we further direct that this Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January 1856.

And we hereby declare and direct that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by Warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Minister of Marine hereby gives notice, that at fully three cable lengths to the north-west of the so-called *Steep Point of the Ooster (Sandbank)*, a large anchor-buoy shaped beacon has been placed, the top of which is painted white, and the remainder with black and white vertical stripes; on the top of the beacon is a triangle painted with similar stripes.

The above beacon is situated in the following landmarks and bearings:—

The church of Haamstede on the east slope of the long white sand-hill, a little to the west of the level.

The steeple of Goedereede on the most westerly summit of the sand-hill, to the east of the five boulders of the westhoofd (Westhead).

In these bearings:—

The tower of the revolving light on Schonwen S.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W.

The Lighthouse on the north coast of Schonwen S.E. by E. slightly East.

The steeple of Goedereede E.S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E., by unadjusted compass, in 8 fathoms or 150 palms' depth, at ordinary low water.

This beacon is distinctly visible at a distance of a German mile from the deck of a pilot boat, the eye being 4 ells above the surface of the water,

and by the black and white stripes can likewise be easily distinguished at a considerable distance from the similar shaped beacons which are placed on the Banjaard, but which are painted entirely white.

The placing of the last-mentioned beacons was publicly announced by notice of the 19th August 1854.
