NAVAL MEDALS FOR THE KAFFIR WAR.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset House, January 24, 1856.

HER Majesty having been graciously pleased to grant a Medal to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines borne on board-

Her Majesty's ship Castor,

Her Majesty's ship Hermes, Her Majesty's ship Styx, Her Majesty's ship Dee, Her Majesty's ship Rhadamanthus,

between the 24th of December 1850 and the 6th of February 1853, for their services in connection with the Army engaged in the Kaffir War during that period,—Notice is hereby given, that all claimants to such Medal, notwithstanding any previous applications, should apply, personally or by letter, to the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset House, (with "Kaffir Medal" outside the application).

Every applicant must state his rank or rating, and the name of the ship or ships on board which he served; also, in the case of every Petty Officer, Seaman, or Marine, it is indispensable that his application should be accompanied by a certificate of service; except in the case of his being on board any of Her Majesty's ships, and the application be made through his commanding officer, in which case this certificate will not be required.

When there are several claimants on board the same ship, it would be desirable that they should make their application in one letter, through the commanding officer of such vessel, in a list alphabetically arranged under the ships in which they were serving at the time, and affording the information above required.
